101. DL Troy Hinds 6-5, 230, 4.6 Kaysville Davis, UT

The #1 prospect in Utah impresses everyone with his all out style of play. A two-time All-Stater, he has the size, range, and quickness to play DE or OLB in college. He should fill out and weigh between 270 and 280 at BYU. Committed to BYU.

102. OL Kyle Murphy 6-7, 275, 5.0 San Clemente, CA

One of the nation's premier OT prospects has not allowed a sack over the past two years and is a two-time All-Southern California honoree. His GPA is 4.0. He has received over 30 offers and has the frame to weigh 310 in college.

103. DL Faith Ekakitie 6-2, 280, 4.85 Lake Forest Academy, IL

A unique ball player with a unique situation. He lives a good part of the year in Canada but plays high school ball in the Chicago area. One of the country's more underrated DT's, he recorded 15 QB sacks in 2010. He plays the game fast, strong, and with a take no prisoners' attitude.

104. TE Taylor McNamara 6-5, 232, 4.78 San Diego Westview, CA

One of the nation's top three TE prospects, he has averaged over 15 yds per catch in his prep career. He shows the ability to create after the catch and is able to run over defenders. An athlete with natural receiving skills. Committed to ARIZONA.

105. DB Brian Poole 5-11, 190, 4.39 Bradenton Southeast, FL

A physical corner who loves to compete, he's an All-County CB who also averaged 7½ yds per carry at TB. He can turn and run with the best of them. Committed to FLORIDA.

106. DB LaDarrell McNeil 6-1, 187, 4.5 Dallas Maceo Smith, TX

The #1 FS prospect in the state of Texas brings size, speed, athletic ability, and attitude to the recruiting table. A two-time All-District honoree, he recorded 132 stops and 3 picks in 2010. Committed to TENNESSEE.

107. OL Avery Young 6-6, 280, 5.0 Palm Beach Gardens, FL

A 1st Team All-Palm Beach County honoree for his play at LT, he shows the ability to dominate from that position. A big, strong, and athletic 280 pounder, he has the frame to weigh well over 300 pounds. Has FSU, FL, AUBURN, OK, GA, SC, and MI in the hunt.

108. QB Chad Voytik 6-0, 192, 4.6 Cleveland, TN

One of the nation's premier signal callers, he shows a strong and accurate arm and a quick release. He's a dynamic offensive player who can get the job done with his arm or his legs. He totaled over 2,000 yds in offense as a junior. His GPA is a perfect 4.0. Committed to PITTSBURGH.

109. LB Jabari Ruffin 6-4, 225, 4.6 Downey, CA

The #1 OLB prospect in the state, Jabari is tall and explosive. He recorded 90 solo tackles to go with 7 QB sacks as a junior. Has a 34" VJ. Committed to USC.

110. WR Thomas Johnson 6-0, 180, 4.4 Dallas Skyline, TX

Plays on one of the most productive high school teams in the state of Texas. He's a go-to WR with average size and above average speed and athletic ability. Plays on a run oriented team but still caught 20 passes for 360 yds and 2 scores. Committed to TEXAS.

111. DB Wayne Morgan 5-11, 190, 4.4 Brooklyn-Erasmus Hall, NY

One of the top two prospects in the state of New York has the kind of speed that will allow him to run with any of the nation's top WR prospects. A two-time All-Brooklyn honoree at CB, he's been timed in a 10.8 100 meters. He's looking at MIAMI, MI, PENN ST, BC, AL, and VA.

112. QB Shane Dillon 6-5, 190, 4.85 El Cajon Christian, CA

He's fighting for the #1 QB ranking in the state of California and he certainly shows the skills to become an All-American. A tall, athletic, and smart QB, he has a strong, accurate arm. He threw for over 3,000 yds and 21 TDs on his way to earning All-San Diego area honors in 2010. Committed to COLORADO.

113. OL Adam Bisnowaty 6-6, 275, 5.4 Fox Chapel Area, PA

In person he looks thin at 275 and on film he's technically sound at the LT position. He shows good pass rushing skills, is quick out of his stance, and shows the potential to become a dominating LT at the next level. Earned 2nd Team All-Area honors at LT.

114. DB Ishmael Adams 5-10, 185, 4.45 Westlake Village-Oaks Christian, CA

He had been somewhat overshadowed by Jordan Payton the past two years but believe me, this young man has what it takes to become an All-American at the CB position. He shows fast hands, can turn and run with the swiftest of receivers, and is very confident and hard working. He ran for over 1,000 yds and totaled 53 tackles in 2010. He's been timed in a 10.8 100 meters.

115. LB James Ross 6-0, 215, 4.57 Orchard Lake St. Mary's, MI

Some people have gotten hung up on his lack of height but there's no doubt James is a ball player. He plays the game low, consistently gets under the pads of blockers, shows great burst, and is excellent in pursuit. Earned 1st Team All-State honors as a junior totaling 95 tackles and 5 sacks. Committed to MICHIGAN.

116. QB Jeff Lindquist 6-3, 225, 4.65 Mercer Island, WA

Jeff has gotten some attention but in my opinion not as much as he deserves. He ranks as one of the nation's premier signal callers. A big kid with a rocket arm and quick feet, he's deadly accurate while throwing on the run. Threw for 2,000 yds and 15 TDs and ran for over 1,000 yds and 18 scores on his way to earning All-State honors in 2010. He's been timed in an 11.5 100 meters. Committed to WASHINGTON.

117. OL Kennedy Estelle 6-7, 305, 5.2 Pearland Dawson, TX

Ranked by many as the top tackle prospect in the state of Texas, he's a natural athlete who graded out at over 85% in his blocking assignments on his way to earning All-Houston area honors in 2010. Blessed with long arms, quick hands, and even quicker feet, he's committed to TEXAS.

118. RB Bri'onte Dunn 6-1, 210, 4.5 Canton Glenoak, OH

The #1 RB prospect in the state of Ohio brings great size, vision, balance, strength, and determination to the recruiting table. He ran for 230 yds and 22 TDs on his way to earning All-Akron area honors as a junior. Committed to OHIO STATE.

119. OL Ronnie Stanley 6-6, 285, 5.0 Las Vegas Bishop Gorman, NV

The #1 prospect in the state of Nevada. In person Ronnie looks thin at 285 and he's one of those big guys who believes he's a basketball player but once he gives up the spot, look out. He has what it takes to become a dominating LT at the next level. Earned 1st Team All-State honors at LT in 2010.

120. DB Armani Reeves 5-11, 190, 4.35 West Roxbury Catholic Memorial, MA

One of the top all around athletes in the country, Armani can become an All-American at the WR or CB positions. Earned All-Boston area honors in 2010 after totaling 37 tackles and 4 picks at CB, catching 42 passes for 1,103 yds, and rushing for 700 yds with 16 TDs on offense. He also returned 3 kicks back for scores. Committed to PENN STATE.

121. DL Sheldon Day 6-2, 275, 4.9 Indianapolis Warren Central, IN
One of the top two prospects in the state is a powerful and explosive DT who dominates the run game, but also has the quickness and body control to nab the QB. Plays the game with a chip on his shoulder aggressively and is non-stop until the whistle. His GPA is 3.8 and he's committed to NOTRE DAME.

122. LB Kwontie Moore 6-2, 230, 4.8 Norfolk Christian, VA
A workmanlike ILB who always seems to get the job done. Many people I talked to considered him to be the most dominating defensive player in the state last year. He totaled 132 tackles, 8 QB sacks, and 29 tackles for losses on his way to earning 1st Team All-Tidewater honors. His GPA is 3.3. Committed to VIRGINIA.

123. OL John Michael McGee 6-4, 260, 4.8 Texarkana-Texas High, TX
Plays LT in high school and will wind up playing guard or center in college. One of the more athletic and quick-footed OL prospects in the Southwest, he has the frame to weigh over 300 pounds. A tough and dedicated ball player, he earned 1st Team All-State honors at LT. Committed to OKLAHOMA.

124. DB Eddie Williams 6-4, 205, 4.5 Panama City Beach Arnold, FL
A tall, wiry, strong, attentive, and instinctive FS who may grow into an LB. He totaled 31 tackles and 2 picks on his way to earning All-Area mention in 2010. Not yet a dominating player but he certainly shows that kind of ability. Committed to AL.

125. RB T.J. Yeldon 6-1, 200, 4.4 Daphne, AL
The #1 RB prospect in the state of Alabama, T.J. is a power back with tremendous athleticism. Strong enough to dominate between the tackles but quick enough to cause damage on the perimeter. He earned All-Mobile honors after averaging over 7 yds per carry in 2010. Committed to AUBURN.

126. DL Jonathan Bullard 6-4, 240, 4.8 Shelby Crest, NC
This guy dominates from his DE position, has an exceptionally quick first step, and is as explosive as they come. A quick twitch athlete with a great motor, he's highly competitive and relentless when in pursuit. He recorded 106 stops and 16 sacks in 2010.

127. WR Justin Ferguson 6-2, 205, 4.6 Pembroke Pines Flanagan, FL
A big, strong, athletic WR with average speed and above average hands and instincts. He caught passes for 963 yds and 12 TDs as a junior. Committed to NOTRE DAME.

128. WR Jaydon Mickens 5-10, 175, 4.4 Los Angeles Dorsey, CA
One of the more explosive ball players in Southern California, he's explosive off the ball, accelerates to full speed in the blink of an eye, and shows consistent hands. He caught 41 passes for 700 yds and 8 TDs on his way to earning All-City honors. He's been timed in a 10.8 100 meters. Committed to USC.

129. WR Zac Brooks 6-1, 180, 4.4 Jonesboro, AR
The #1 prospect in the state of Arkansas and one of the country's finest all around athletes. He shows All-American ability at WR, RB, and DB. He's been timed in a 10.6 100 meters. Committed to CLEMSON.

130. LB Noor Davis 6-4, 225, 4.6 The Villages, FL
If you are looking for an OLB with size, long arms, quick feet, great range, and smarts, look no further than Mr. Davis. He has a perfect 4.3 GPA and looks thin at 225 pounds. Committed to STANFORD.

131. DL Jarontay Jones 6-3, 240, 4.7 Stone Mountain Stephenson, GA

Opposing coaches have been very impressed with his quickness in shooting gaps and making plays in their backfield. He's a hard worker who will not stay blocked. Recorded 90 tackles and 14 sacks on his way to earning All-Atlanta area honors in 2010. Committed to VIRGINIA TECH.

132. TE Jesse James 6-8, 246, 4.8 McKeesport S. Allegheny, PA
The fastest rising TE prospect in the country, he shows the height, long arms, and quick feet to dominate at the position. He also has the frame to eventually grow into an OT. A top-notch heavyweight wrestler, he's committed to PENN STATE.

133. DB Jordan Diggs 6-0, 194, 4.6 Ft. Meyers Bishop Verot, FL
Not a blazer but he does everything well. On film #9 is one of the more physical defenders in the state. A hybrid type of FS, he has also played a little OLB but is best suited to play FS in college. Totaled 62 tackles and 3 picks in 2010. Looking at MI ST, TN, VANDY, MI, OH ST, SC, and FL.

134. WR Andre McDonald 6-3, 200, 4.47 Minnetonka Hopkins, MN
One of the top two prospects in the state, on film #12 can really stretch a defense. He caught 64 passes for 1,144 yds and 19 TDs averaging 18 yds per catch as a junior. He's a great combination of size, speed, power, and desire.

135. WR Aaron Burbridge 6-1, 175, 4.4 Farmington Hills Harrison, MI
The #1 WR prospect in the state, he's a good route runner with blazing speed. He caught 30 passes for 620 yds averaging 20.7 yds per catch in 2010. Committed to MICHIGAN STATE.

136. LB Brian Nance 6-3, 210, 4.6 Euless Trinity, TX
One of the more heavily sought after defensive players in the Metroplex, Brian recorded 121 stops, 4 picks, and returned 2 of them back for scores in 2010 on his way to earning class 5A 1st Team All-State honors.

137. LB Quanzell Lambert 6-2, 230, 4.6 Sicklerville-Timber Creek, NJ
The #1 LB prospect in the Garden State does a great job of slipping blocks and flowing to the ball. He is rarely caught off his feet and recorded 118 stops and 8 sacks on his way to earning 1st Team All-State honors.

138. DB Elijah Shumate 6-1, 205, 4.5 Ramsey Don Bosco Prep, NJ
I first met Elijah at Patterson Catholic two years ago. When the school closed he moved to Don Bosco and never skipped a beat. A big, physical SS, he can hit like a linebacker. He recorded 65 tackles and 5½ sacks as a junior. He's been timed in a 10.9 100 meters.

139. DB Demetrious Cox 6-1, 195, 4.5 Jeannette, PA
The #1 DB prospect in the state plays FS and could eventually wind up playing LB in college. An All-League performer at both DB and QB, he's a playmaker who is always around the ball.

140. RB Keivarae Russell 6-0, 175, 4.5 Everett Mariner, WA
The #1 skill position player in the Pacific Northwest shows the ability to play RB, FS, WR, or CB in college. His football IQ is very high, he catches the ball well coming out of the backfield and has proven to be a good cut-back runner.

141. WR Amara Darboh 6-2, 200, 4.42 West Des Moines Dowling, IA
The #1 player in the state of Iowa, he's a WR who can stretch a defense. Caught 25 passes for 371 yds and 11 TDs in just six games on his way to earning 2nd Team All-State honors. He has also long jumped 22' 10" and averages 10 points a game as a guard in basketball.

142. OL Michael Flint 6-4, 303, 5.2 Oxford, AL
The #1 OL prospect in the state of Alabama plays tackle in high school but could wind up playing guard in college. He's very agile and light on his feet for a 303 pounder and he's a solid competitor. Tough and durable, he shows great strength at the point of attack. Committed to AUBURN.

143. QB David Thompson 6-2, 195, 4.6 Palmetto Bay

Not only is David one of the country's finest QB prospects who totaled well over 2,500 yds in offense in 2010 but he's also considered to be one of the top baseball players in the country. He has already shattered the state of Florida's career home run record with 47. Like Bubba Starling, David will have to make a choice between football or a major league baseball contract.

144. QB Zach Kline 6-2, 210, 4.9 Danville San Ramon Valley, CA

A two-time Prep Football Report All-American, he certainly shows the arm strength, poise, and smarts the college scouts are looking for in a signal caller. His GPA is 3.5. Committed to CAL.

145. DB Alex Carter 6-1, 190, 4.4 Ashburn Briar Woods, VA

The #1 athlete in Northern Virginia is the son of 1989 PFR All-American Tom Carter. A smooth athlete who stays low in his backpedal, he plays the CB position with an awful lot of confidence and he's a tall, productive lockdown corner. His GPA is a perfect 4.1. Committed to STANFORD.

146. OL Jaleel Johnson 6-4, 290, 5.3 Lombard Montini, IL

He has been a dominating DT the past couple of years at St. Joseph's High School. He transferred to perennial state champ Montini this spring and has gotten off to a great start at both DT and OT. It's my belief that he has All-American skills at OL and could wind up playing OG in college. He recorded 44 tackles and 3 sacks in 2010. Committed to IOWA.

147. RB Drew Harris 6-1, 207, 4.46 Exton Downingtown East, PA

A workhorse of a back who is underrated but brings great size, determination, and surprising speed to the recruiting table. He has averaged over 7 yds per carry in his prep career. He's been timed in a 10.9 100 meters in track.

148. RB I'Tavius Mathers 5-11, 190, 4.4 Murfreesboro Blackman, TN

Here's one of the most underrated backs in the country. I've watched I'Tavius over the past two years and came away thinking he has what it takes to explode onto the college scene as a true freshman. He's big, strong, quick, and instinctive with great vision, and most of all tremendous production. Rushed for 2,716 yds and 31 TDs on his way to earning 1st Team All-State honors in 2010. Committed to OLE MISS.

149. DB Kendall Sanders 6-1, 180, 4.4 Athens, TX

One of the better all around athletes in Northeast Texas, he could wind up playing either CB or FS in college. Shows great range and an aggressive style of play. Committed to OKLAHOMA STATE.

150. LB Camren Williams 6-2, 220, 4.58 West Roxbury-
Catholic Memorial, MA

He has played OLB the past two years but has started playing ILB this season. Powerfully built, he's a consistent and strong tackler. Very fluid in his movements, he does a great job of avoiding blocks and finding the ball. He played in only five games in 2010 due to a knee injury but still totaled close to 60 tackles in those five games. Committed to PENN STATE.

151. LB Josh Perry 6-3, 225, 4.6 Lewis Center Olentangy, OH

Another underrated LB prospect who played DE in 2010 but has been recruited at the OLB position. Quick, tough, and instinctive, he's one of the more athletic LB prospects in the Midwest. He recorded 52 tackles and 12 sacks on his way to earning All-Columbus area honors. His GPA is 3.8. Committed to OHIO STATE.

152. LB Michael Barton 6-1, 205, 4.57 Concord De LaSalle, CA

A bit undersized but one of the more productive defenders in California. Earned All-State mention after totaling 72 tackles and 3 sacks in 2010. He's known for shooting gaps and hammering ball carriers.

He has the ability to quickly turn and run to defend against the pass. Instinctive and smart, he's committed to CAL.

153. OL Curtis Riser 6-4, 280, 4.98 Desoto, TX

A high school tackle who will wind up playing guard in college, he shows great footwork, excels as a pass blocker, and has proven to be very quick and fast for a 280 pounder. Earned 1st Team All-Dallas area honors for his play at OT. Committed to TEXAS.

154. WR Bryce Treggs 6-0, 170, 4.5 Bellflower St. John Bosco, CA

Not the tallest receiver around but one of the more creative offensive players in Southern California. As a junior he caught 56 passes for 1,012 yds and 12 TDs averaging 18 yds per catch. He also recorded 33 stops and 4 picks at CB. He's been timed in a 10.8 100 meters. Committed to CALIFORNIA.

155. DL James DeLoach 6-3, 260, 4.89 Millen Jenkins County, GA

A superior talent at the DE position who could wind up playing DT at the next level. He shows cat-like quickness, a great burst, and explosive moves. Played in only four games in 2010 due to a broken arm but still managed 25 tackles and 10 sacks in just four games. Benches 330 and has a 3.8 GPA. Committed to GEORGIA.

156. DL Moana Ofahengaue 6-4, 210, 4.6 Saratoga Westlake, UT

Forget about his lack of weight, this young man is one of the best pass rushers in the country. He totaled 23 QB sacks in 2010, he's relentless in pursuit, and shows an uncanny knack of avoiding blocks and getting to the QB. He is being nationally recruited and has offers from Michigan, FSU, Nebraska, and Oregon.

157. RB Mike Davis 5-11, 194, 4.49 Stone Mountain Stephenson, GA

His brother was a standout back at Clemson and at this stage Mike is an even better RB prospect. His film shows a back who has the ability to break tackles, great vision, quick feet, and tremendous moves. Averaged over 8 yds per carry against great competition in 2010. Committed to FLORIDA.

158. OL Nick Davidson 6-6, 270, 5.1 Eden Prairie, MN

His father Jeff was an All-American in my magazine back in the 1980's. Nick has played most of his high school ball in Charlotte, NC but his father took a job with the Minnesota Vikings and this year he's playing at Eden Prairie. An OT with excellent feet, good strength, and great technique. Has the frame to weigh 310 in college. Plays LT in high school and should play that position at the next level. His GPA is a perfect 4.7 and benches 385.

159. RB Jovan Robinson 6-0, 215, 4.5 Memphis Wooddale, TN

A good sized back who shows tremendous moves, can make sharp cuts, and has the burst to quickly get through holes. Rushed for 2,030 yds and 29 TDs in 2010. Committed to AUBURN.

160. LB Deaysean Rippy 6-2, 205, 4.6 McKees Rocks Sto-Rox, PA

The #1 LB prospect in the state of Pennsylvania, on film Deaysean has played OLB, ILB and FS. He's a defender who attacks the ball, he's fast and quick with excellent instincts and can break down in open space and make plays. Recorded 80 tackles, 9 sacks, and 3 picks on his way to earning All-Western PA honors as a junior.

161. QB Robert Gregory 6-3, 195, 4.4 Chicago Simeon, IL

One of the nation's most talented signal callers. College scouts do not know what to make of Mr. Gregory. He's not yet a polished passer but shows good arm strength, the ability to effectively throw the ball while on the run, and the speed to take the ball the distance. He accounted for 2,800 yds and 50 TDs on his way to earning Public League Player of the Year honors in 2010. He's been timed in a 11 flat 100 meters. MN, IL, KS, and MI STATE lead.

162. LB Jordan Richmond 6-2, 225, 4.7 Denton Ryan, TX

On a team loaded with blue chip defenders Jordan really stands out. A smart football player with excellent footwork, he recorded 138 stops and 20 tackles for losses on his way to earning All-District and All-State honors. This defensive captain has led his team to a 15 and 1 record in 2010. Committed to TEXAS A&M.

163. OL Ryan Brodie 6-5, 270, 4.95 Long Branch High, NJ

A two-way standout who could wind up playing either LT or DE in college. He shows the footwork, long arms, quickness, and explosive moves the college scouts love to see in an LT. Earned 1st Team All-Region honors for his play on offense. His GPA is 3.2.

164. WB Jermon Hopper 6-0, 170, 4.4 Charlotte Phillip O'Berry, NC

One of the finer all around athletes in the state of North Carolina, his 2010 film has him playing RB, WR, CB, and FS. Fast, quick, and versatile, he ranks among the state's top punt and kickoff returners. He totaled close to 2,000 yds in offense in 2010 and in his prep career he has returned 15 punts and kickoffs back for scores. He's been timed in a 10.6 100 meters. Committed to CLEMSON.

165. WR Derrick Woods 6-0, 185, 4.4 Inglewood, CA

Not the tallest WR around but certainly one of the quickest and more productive ones. He latched onto 89 passes for 1,165 yds and 17 TDs on his way to earning All-City honors in 2010. Blessed with a great vertical, strong hands, and good instincts. His GPA is close to a 3.5.

166. OL Evan Boehm 6-3, 286, 5.1 Lee's Summit West, MO

The #1 OL prospect in the state and one of the country's finest guard/center prospects. Has a great frame, he should weigh 320 in college. A blue collar OL who is tough as nails and always gives great effort. Earned 1st Team All-State honors for his play at guard in 2010. His GPA is 3.5. Committed to MISSOURI.

167. DB Tyvis Powell 6-3, 180, 4.48 Bedford, OH

In my opinion he's one of the fastest rising FS prospects in the country, however, he prefers to play CB, the position he plays in high school. He can turn and run with the best of them, he's fluid with great body control, balance, and burst. Was credited with 65 tackles and 4 picks on his way to earning All-League honors in 2010. He's been timed in an 11 flat 100 meters in track. Committed to OHIO STATE.

168. OL Paul Thurston 6-5, 270, 5.0 Arvada West, CO

One of the more technically sound OL prospects in the country, he plays LT in high school and could wind up playing anywhere along the offensive line in college. Has the length and athleticism the college scouts love to see and he's your prototypical pass protector who can bend his knees, shows quick feet, and the ability to slide and mirror. Earned 1st Team All-State honors in 2010. Committed to NEBRASKA.

169. WR Deontay McManus 6-2, 208, 4.5 Baltimore Dunbar, MD

Here's a ball player who has a chance to explode onto the college scene and has the size, strength, instincts, and production needed to become a go-to player on offense. Caught 25 passes for 341 yds and 5 TDs on offense and recorded 88 tackles and 4 picks at FS. Committed to WEST VIRGINIA.

170. OL Brock Stadnik 6-5, 285, 5.1 Greensboro Western Guilford, NC

A powerhouse of an OT who could wind up playing OT or OG in college. One of the more explosive 285 pounders you will find, he plays an aggressive brand of football that helped him earn All-City, All-Area, and All-Region honors in 2010. Committed to SOUTH CAROLINA.

171. DB D.J. Singleton 6-2, 200, 4.46 Jersey City St. Peter's Prep, NJ

Plays SS in high school and could wind up playing OLB, SS, or FS in college. The scouts love his size, speed, instincts, and work ethic. He's averaged over 6 yds per carry on offense and should wind up playing defense in college. Committed to WISCONSIN.

172. LB Ukeme Eligwe 6-2, 210, 4.7

Stone Mountain
Stephenson, GA

He had been overshadowed by the great defensive talent at Stephenson High School but after watching Ukeme on film you come away knowing he has what it takes to make an impact at the next level. He's excellent in pursuit, plays the game on his feet, and can make plays from sideline to sideline. Committed to FLORIDA STATE.

173. DL Greg McMullen 6-5, 270, 4.69 Akron Hoban, OH

In a year of great DE prospects in the state of Ohio Greg really stands out. A big, athletic, and quick as a cat DE, he has great balance, burst, and body control. He recorded 11 QB sacks and 18 tackles for losses as a junior on his way to earning All-City honors. He's also a standout in basketball. Committed to NEBRASKA.

174. TE Blake Thomas 6-4, 245, 4.75 Cleveland St. Ignatius, OH

There are five big-time TE prospects in the state of Ohio and one of the very best is Mr. Thomas. He caught 25 passes for 300 yds and 3 TDs last season. He's a skilled run blocker, runs precise routes, and shows sure hands. Committed to OHIO STATE.

175. WR Jordan Westerkamp 6-1, 195, 4.49 Lombard Montini Catholic, IL

One of the more productive WR prospects in the Midwest, he caught 89 passes for 1,650 yds and 23 TDs averaging 18½ yds per catch in 2010. A quick, smart, and sure handed receiver, he catches the ball away from his body. He understands defenses and knows how to take advantage of zone coverages. At the high school level he's an impact player. Committed to NEBRASKA.
