Players 176-300 have Four Stars

176. OL Max Tuerk 6-6, 285, 5.1 Santa Margarita, CA

If you are looking for an LT with an aggressive, tough, and hard-nosed style of play look no further than Mr. Tuerk. He's an exceptional run blocker with the quickness and body control to successfully block out on the second level. Benches 375. Committed to USC.

177. DL Tyriq McCord 6-2, 220, 4.6 Tampa Jefferson, FL

Not the biggest DE around but certainly one of the quickest ones. Very athletic, he gets great leverage, sheds blockers quickly, and can get to the ball. He recorded 9 QB sacks in 2010.

178. TE Devin Funchess 6-4, 210, 4.6 Farmington Hills Harrison, MI

As a receiver he's a hybrid who could wind up playing WR or TE. In person he certainly looks like he can carry an extra 30 to 40 pounds. He runs exceptionally well with great hands and tremendous moves and instincts. Caught 36 passes for 738 yds and 6 TDs averaging 20 yds per catch as a junior. Committed to MICHIGAN.

179. DL Pharaoh Brown 6-7, 215, 4.65 Lindhurst Brush, OH

Here's one to keep an eye on. It's an unbelievable year for DE prospects in the state of Ohio and when it's all said and done, Pharaoh may wind up at the top of the list. He needs to fill out and get stronger but certainly has the long arms, quick feet, and instincts to become a difference maker type of DE. Had 8 sacks and 21 QB pressures in 2010. Committed to MICHIGAN.

180. DL Ondre Pipkins 6-3, 320, 5.1 Kansas City Park Hill, MO

I watched Ondre perform down in San Antonio and was impressed with him at DT but even more impressed with him as an OL. He will get his chance at DT at the next level but could wind up being an All-American guard in college. Committed to MICHIGAN.

181. WB Sterling Shepard 5-10, 175, 4.4 Oklahoma City Heritage Hall, OK

An All-American possibility at RB, WR, WB, and DB. One of the two most exciting players in the state of Oklahoma, he totaled well over 2,000 yds in offense in 2010 and also returned 6 kickoff's back for scores. He was credited with 103 tackles at CB. Committed to OKLAHOMA.

182. ATH Brandon Napoleon 6-0, 177, 4.4 Jersey City St. Peter's Prep, NJ

I don't like to list too many players as an athlete but Brandon is certainly one who fits that description. He's a QB in high school and can get the job done, and I believe he has what it takes to play that position at the next level. However, he may be better suited to play CB in college. He threw for 977 yds and ran for 340 additional yards as a junior. Committed to WEST VIRGINIA.

183. DB Reese Fleming 6-0, 180, 4.35 Chicago Curie, IL

A QB in high school who threw for 1,200 yds and ran for 607 other yds but has been recruited at the CB position where he totaled 11 solo tackles and broke up 7 passes seeing spot duty at that position. Super fast, he's been timed in a 10.8 100 meters in track. He certainly shows the instincts, timing, anticipation, and ball skills to become an impact player at CB. Committed to IOWA.

184. DB Donaldven Manning 5-10, 155, 4.45 Miami Central, FL

Don't let his lack of weight fool you, there are very few cover corners with his kind of ability and attitude. He shows loose hips, a very smooth backpedal, and closes like no one's business. He needs to add 20 pounds and once he does, look out. One of the nation's premier cover corners.

185. OL Michael Starts 6-4, 285, 5.0 Waco LaVega, TX

A two-way tackle who shows All-American ability at OG. Big, tough, and strong, he earned All-Central Texas honors for his play as a junior. Committed to TEXAS TECH.

186. WR D'Vario Montgomery 6-2, 200, 4.5 Winter Park, FL

One of the premier players in central Florida, he has played QB, RB, WR, TE, OLB, ILB, and FS in high school. This season he is slotted to play WR and FS, and possibly even OLB for the Winter Park team.

187. DL Courtney Wynn 6-5, 245, 4.8 Norfolk Christian, VA

An opposing figure and a good combination of power and speed. Very explosive, he uses his long arms to extend and keep blockers away from his body. He has the frame to weigh between 270 and 280 in college. Totaled 105 tackles and 10 sacks in 2010. Committed to VIRGINIA.

188. LB Tim Cole 6-2, 210, 4.68 Brenham, TX

One of the top three ILB prospects in the Lone Star state, he totaled 69 tackles and 10 tackles for losses on his way to earning All-State honors as a junior. Committed to TEXAS.

189. RB Warren Ball 6-2, 215, 4.4 Columbus St. Francis DeSales, OH

Smart, big, strong, and instinctive, he has a perfect 4.0 GPA and earned All-City honors in 2010 after averaging 7 yds per carry. Committed to OHIO STATE.

190. OL Chris Muller 6-7, 290, 5.2 Boyertown, PA

A physically impressive looking OT with the length, long arms, and build the college scouts are looking for in an LT. Earned All-League and All-Area honors for his play at OT and graded out at over 80% in high blocking assignments. Committed to RUTGERS.

191. DL Leonard Williams 6-5, 257, 4.8 Daytona Beach Mainland, FL

A physical specimen who improved by leaps and bounds during the 2010 season. He's a big-framed player who could weigh 300 pounds in college and wind up playing DT. Recorded 94 stops and 3 sacks as a junior.

192. LB James Burgess 6-0, 210, 4.59 Homestead, FL

This school has produced a good number of Division I players over the years and Head Coach McCray calls James the top ILB he has coached. His hero is Ray Lewis and his coach says he's a high school version of the Raven's all-pro. He recorded 132 stops in 2010. Committed to MIAMI.

193. DL Dalvin Tomlinson 6-3, 280, 4.9 McDonough Henry Co., GA

The fastest rising defensive player in the state, he gets to full speed fast and has proven to be a brick wall against the run. As good as they get, he plays more DE than DT but could wind up playing DT in college.

194. TE Justin Meredith 6-5, 220, 4.58 Anderson T.J. Hanna, SC

The #1 TE prospect in South Carolina and he ranks as the nation's #4 TE. A thin looking 220 pounder, he runs great routes, catches everything within reach, and is a tremendous lead blocker. He can also split out and play WR. His GPA is 3.7. Committed to NORTH CAROLINA.

195. RB Wes Brown 6-0, 190, 4.5 Olney Good Council, MD

The #1 RB prospect in the state who plays on one of the country's more productive offenses. Blessed with good size, terrific vision, balance, and surprising strength. He rushed for 600 yds and 10 TDs on just 65 carries last season.

196. LB Ken Ekanem 6-3, 225, 4.6 Clifton Centreville, VA

An undersized DE who could wind up playing OLB or DE in college. Recorded 17 QB sacks on his way to earning All-Metro honors in 2010. A fine all around athlete who is also a standout in basketball.

197. WR Javon Williams 6-5, 180, 4.55 Chandler, AZ

If you are looking for a WR prospect with the potential to become a go-to guy at the next level, look no further than Mr. Williams. A red-zone standout with good leaping ability and concentration, he really came into his own in 2010 catching a good number of passes from All-American QB Brett Hundley.

198. DL Jarvis Lewis 6-3, 240, 4.9 Scottsdale Chaparral, AZ

He played at Glendale Kellis last season and earned 1st Team All-State honors after totaling 58 tackles and 13 sacks. He can bend off the edge and shows strong hands and very good football instincts. There is some question about his eligibility this year because of the transfer.

199. DB Tracy Howard 5-11, 175, 4.5 Miramar, FL

Earned All-Broward County honors in 2010 after picking off 4 passes and totaling 40 tackles at CB. Shows very good instincts, can be physical against the run, and closes on the ball quickly.

200. RB William Mahone 5-11, 206, 4.59 Austintown Fitch, OH

Not the most spectacular back around but might be the best all around back in the state. A north/south runner with tremendous strength, vision, and balance, he showed the versatility to play TB, WB, or FB. He's also adept at returning punts and kickoffs. He totaled 35 tackles and 4 picks at SS. In fact, Ohio State's recruiting him at the SS position. Most of the other schools, NOTRE DAME, MI ST, MI, and PENN ST like him at RB.

201. WR Dominique Wheeler 6-2, 180, 4.45 Crockett, TX

A high school RB who could wind up playing RB, WB, or WR in college. Ran for 1,164 yds and 16 TDs averaging an astounding 16 yds per carry in 2010. Committed to TEXAS TECH.

202. OL Jeremy Ward 6-4, 275, 5.0 Pottsville, AR

The #1 OL prospect in the state can play tackle, guard, center, and long snap. Earned 1st Team All-State honors after grading out at 89% in his blocking assignments in 2010 and totaling 27 pancake blocks. Committed to ARKANSAS.

203. OL Jonah Pirsig 6-9, 300, 5.2 Blue Earth Area, MN

One of the top two prospects in the land of 10,000 lakes, he surprises you with his body control and ability to re-direct. He has what it takes to become a dominating LT at the next level. Earned All-Area and All-State honors for his play at OT. Committed to MINNESOTA.

204. DL Carlos Watkins 6-4, 270, 4.9 Forest City Chase, NC

An All-League and All-Area performer at DL, he could wind up playing DE or DT. Quick and powerful off the snap, he shows good balance after initial contact, keeps his pads low, and is always moving forward.

205. LB Royce Jenkins-Stone 6-2, 218, 4.56 Detroit Cass Tech, MI

Plays on the most talented team in the state, he's a dynamic backer who totaled 90 tackles and 6 sacks as a junior. Benches 335 and is committed to MICHIGAN.

206. QB Trevor Knight 6-2, 190, 4.7 San Antonio Reagan, TX

There are no sure fire QB prospects in the state of Texas but a lot of good ones. He threw for 1,174 yds and 9 TDs and ran for 622 yds and 2 scores in 2010. Committed to OKLAHOMA.

207. WR Ian Thomas 6-2, 190, 4.5 Reisterstown Franklin, MD

There are at least five WR prospects in the state of Maryland with difference maker type of ability and Ian is certainly one of them. He caught 50 passes for 953 yds and 15 TDs and gained 1,326 all-purpose yards in 2010.

208. OL Oliver Jones 6-6, 295, 5.1 Ninety-Six High, SC

He missed a good part of the 2010 season due to injuries but has gotten off to a great start this year. He's a technically sound OT who looks thin at 295 pounds. Long limbed and rangy, he's as agile as they come. He's also a standout in basketball and track. Committed to CLEMSON.

209. DE Tom Strobel 6-6, 250, 4.8 Memtor, OH

It's a great year for DE prospects in the state of Ohio and Tom ranks right near the top of that group. He totaled 40 tackles, 3 sacks, and 32 QB pressures in 2010. Has the frame to weigh between 270 and 280 in college. His GPA is 3.7. Committed to MICHIGAN.

210. OL Ryan Ward 6-5, 275, 5.2 New Lenox Providence Catholic, IL

If you are looking for a technically sound and athletic 275 pounder, look no further than #75. He shows good agility, flexibility, long arms, and the quick feet to remain at the LT position. Has the frame to weigh between 310 and 320 in college and earned All-Area honors for his play at OT. Committed to IOWA.

211. DL Jamil Pollard 6-4, 285, 4.9 West Deptford, NJ

Physically he already looks like a college player, he just fires off the snap and is an explosive, violent tackler. He shows quick hands and surprising range for a 285 pounder. He graded out at 85% in his blocking assignments on offense and recorded 57 stops on defense.

212. QB Maty Mauk 6-2, 195, 4.5 Kenton, OH

The #1 signal caller in Ohio and one of the nation's premier spread offense QB's. On film he blows you away with his passing accuracy. He shows the ability to make all the throws, can throw the deep out to the wide side with authority, and always seems to nail the receivers on the crossing routes. He threw for 5,670 yds and 69 TDs as a junior earning 1st Team All-State honors in the process. Committed to MISSOURI.

213. QB Austin Appleby 6-5, 225, 4.8 North Canton Hoover, OH

He missed half the 2010 season due to a knee injury but is now completely healed and by the end of the year he will rank as one of the nation's premier signal callers. Threw for 1,477 yds and 14 TDs in 2010. Committed to PURDUE.

214. DL Earl Moore 6-2, 281, 5.0 Tampa Hillsborough, FL

One of the top two players in the Tampa area and one of the nation's finest NG prospects. Super strong at the point of attack, he's aggressive, tough, and quick footed. Recorded 79 tackles and 4 sacks in 2010.

215. DL Chris Casher 6-4, 222, 4.65 Mobile Faith Academy, AL

A tall, skinny DE with length, long arms, and quick feet. A two-time All-City honoree at both DE and OLB, he is committed to FSU.

216. DB LaTroy Pittman 6-4, 200, 4.6 Citra North Marion, FL

An All-American candidate at both the WR and DB positions. On defense he's aggressive in pursuit, rarely over runs plays and is quick enough to cover slot receivers. Earned All-Area mention for his play on both sides of the ball, he is committed to FLORIDA.

217. TE Dillon Gordon 6-5, 260, 4.9 River Ridge John Curtis, LA

One of the top five players in the state, he's an exceptional run blocker who also shows great hands. He is very capable of playing in-line or out-wide. He caught 12 passes for 200 yds and 2 scores and also batted over .500 in baseball. Committed to LSU.

218. LB Reggie Northrup 6-2, 220, 4.6 Jacksonville First Coast, FL

A sure tackler with good instincts, he can play either OLB or ILB at the next level. Recorded 108 stops and 8 sacks on his way to earning All-City mention. He was also 57 and 6 as a 215 pound wrestler. Committed to MIAMI.

219. WB Randy Johnson 5-9, 170, 4.5 Miami Norland, FL

A small, explosive back who fits perfectly into a spread offense but can also cause damage from the I. Last season he burst onto the Dade Co. scene displaying terrific vision, balance, and burst. Ran for 1,540 yds and 24 TDs averaging over 10 yds per carry. Committed to MIAMI.

220. LB Canaan Severin 6-2, 215, 4.7 Worchester Academy, MA

An athlete who can play WR or FS and has the size, strength, and production to become an outstanding ILB in college. Earned All-League honors for his play on both sides of the ball.

221. DE Chris Wormley 6-4, 255, 4.7 Toledo Whitmer, OH

A tall, explosive DE, he's very strong, active, and athletic. If he puts his mind to it there can be no stopping him. He's fluid in his movements and strong at the point of attack. Recorded 90 tackles and 12 QB sacks in 2010. Committed to MICHIGAN.

222. LB Scott Starr 6-4, 230, 4.6 Norco, CA

A big, physical looking OLB who could wind up playing DE in college. Recorded 114 stops & 22 tackles for losses as a junior, and has been timed in a 10.8 100 meters in track. Benches 335. Committed to USC.

223. TE Jalen Cope-Fitzpatrick 6-5, 260, 4.9 Rocklin Whitney, CA

As big, quick, and physical as they come, he's a gifted TE with surprising quickness and speed and he could grow into an OL. Committed to USC.

224. DB Jarrod Wilson 6-2, 190, 4.5 Akron Buchtel, OH

The #1 FS prospect in the state of Ohio, he's a ball hawk who attacks the ball like a receiver. Very athletic and fluid in his movements, he recorded 60 stops, 7 picks, and batted down 12 passes on his way to earning All-City honors. Committed to MICHIGAN.

225. DB Alphonso Marsh 6-3, 181, 4.49 Compton Dominguez, CA

If you are look for a tall CB, look no further than #6. Phonso possesses the instincts to play either CB or FS in college. Recorded 43 tackles, 6 QB sacks, 4 picks, and broke up a league high 19 passes in 2010. He's been timed in a 22 flat 200 meters.

226. DB Kevon Seymour 6-0, 170, 4.5 Pasadena Muir, CA

There are a lot of good CB prospects in the state of California this year and one of the very best is Mr. Seymour. reads routes well, rarely gets fooled, and is smooth in transition. Can also play WR, RB, and QB.

227. WB Drae Bowles 6-2, 195, 4.5 Jackson Christian, TN

One of the top three prospects in the Memphis area, he's a two-time All-City honoree at WR. He's a sure handed receiver who is tough to bring down in the open field. Committed to TENNESSEE.

228. DE LaTroy Lewis 6-4, 235, 4.7 Akron Hoban, OH

He teams with Greg McMullen to give Hoban two All-American DE prospects. Totaled 74 tackles and 6½ sacks last season, and this year he got injured in the very first game of the season and his return is questionable. Earned 1st Team All-Akron honors in 2010. Committed to TENNESSEE.

229. WR Ricardo Louis 6-2, 205, 4.5 Miami Beach, FL

Another one of the more high recruited South Florida standouts who could wind up on either side of the ball in college. Plays QB in high school and will wind up playing WR or FS in college. Committed to AUBURN.

230. LB Donavin Newsom 6-2, 225, 4.46 St. Louis Parkway North, MO

An elite LB prospect who has just what the college scouts are looking for in size, super speed, strength, aggressiveness, and production. He recorded 97 stops and 7 sacks and also returned a kickoff 96 yds for a score in 2010. Committed to MISSOURI.

231. DE Martin Aiken 6-3, 248, 4.9 Bamberg-Ehrhardt, SC

A speed rusher with good range, he's solid against the run showing remarkable balance, burst, and timing. He was credited with 106 tackles and 13 QB sacks to go with 36 tackles for losses in 2010. Committed to CLEMSON.

232. WR Jalen Cobb 6-2, 180, 4.6 Warren, AR

One of the top three prospects in the state, he caught 34 passes for 825 yds and 9 scores as a junior. Has long jumped 22' in track and averages 21 points a game as a shooting guard in basketball. Committed to ARKANSAS.

233. OL Walker Williams 6-7, 320, 5.3 Tacoma Baptist, WA

He's not there yet but believe me this young man has five-star potential. A big, physical, and athletic 320 pounder, once he catches on look out. He's a 1st Team All-City honoree at tackle and one of the more impressive looking OL prospects in the country.

234. QB Wes Lunt 6-5, 195, 4.76 Rochester, IL

The #1 prospect in Central Illinois shows outstanding arm strength. He can throw the deep out with authority, has a smooth delivery, and although not a runner, he shows good mobility. He threw for 3,125 yds and 30 TDs on his way to earning All-State honors and led his team to a 4A state championship. Committed to OKLAHOMA STATE.

235. OL Pat Miller 6-7, 260, 5.0 Palm Beach Gardens Dwyer, FL

Here's another OL who needs to become more consistent but has the potential to become a five-star player. Looks thin at 260, he runs exceptionally well and shows good body control and agility. Earned 1st Team All-County honors at OT.

236. WB Jody Fuller 6-0, 200, 4.48 Monroe Sun Valley, NC

A big, physical receiver who can out muscle most DB's for the ball, runs good routes, and is known for his big play capabilities. In 2010 he latched onto 70 passes for 840 yds and 14 TDs. Committed to SOUTH CAROLINA.

237. ATH Marcus Maye 6-1, 195, 4.47 Melbourne Holy Trinity, FL

One of the county's finest all around athletes has the ability to play WR, WB, CB, or FS in college. Shows great vision on offense and terrific reactions on defense. Rushed for over 1,000 yds and 17 TDs averaging 11 yds per carry, and he broke up a league high 18 passes at CB. Committed to FLORIDA.

238. DB Amos Leggett 5-11, 180, 4.5 Homestead, FL

A transfer from Gulliver Prep who has proven to be a very dominating CB in an area full of dominating CB's. Recorded 25 tackles, picked off 6 passes, and broke up 9 others as a junior. Committed to MIAMI.

239. LB Peter Jinkens 6-1, 200, 4.4 Dallas Skyline, TX

Not yet a finished product but believe me this young man can fly. He can run down most backs from behind, plays a physical game, and has the frame to weigh 240 pounds. Committed to TEXAS.

240. DL Justin Shanks 6-3, 288, 5.0 Prattville, AL

This school is loaded with potential All-Americans and Justin ranks right at the top. Recorded 42 tackles, 6 sacks, and 20 tackles for losses in 2010. He's a surprisingly quick-footed, tough, and instinctive DT. Committed to FLORIDA STATE.

241. DL Nick James 6-5, 329, 4.89 Long Beach, MS

He dominated the action down in San Antonio this past January and when he puts his mind to it Nick becomes an unstoppable force. Recorded 48 tackles and 12 sacks as a junior to go with 35 tackles for losses.

242. DB Brandon Beaver 6-1, 182, 4.6 Compton Dominguez, CA

An outstanding two-way player who ranks as one of the top CB prospects in Southern California. Recorded 81 stops and 5 picks at CB. He's athletic with very good football speed.

243. RB Imani Cross 6-1, 220, 4.53 Gainesville North Hall, GA

One of the best big backs in the country, he could play TB or FB at the next level. Benches 375 and has a 36" VJ. Averaged 9.4 yds per carry and did not fumble all season. Committed to TENNESSEE.

244. DL Trent Taylor 6-3, 255, 4.7 Lakeland Lake Gibson, FL

Has the frame to weigh 275 in college and add that to his relentless style of play and you've got yourself an outstanding DE prospect. Recorded 15 QB sacks to go with 99 stops on his way to earning All-County honors. Committed to MIAMI.

245. QB Faton Bauta 6-3, 220, 4.55 West Palm Beach Dwyer, FL

A transfer from Brooklyn's Poly Prep this past winter, he is being recruited at both the QB and LB positions. He totaled 62 tackles and rushed for 540 yds and 7 TDs in New York.

246. WR Darius Powe 6-1, 190, 4.4 Lakewood, CA

Caught 43 passes for 822 yds and 6 scores averaging 19 yds per catch in 2010, he's tall, athletic, and has been blessed with very strong hands.

247. RB Jahleel Pinner 6-1, 225, 4.6 Mission Viejo, CA

A power back who could wind up playing TB or FB in college. He ran for 749 yds and 4 TDs averaging 6.5 yds per carry last season. Committed to USC.

248. DL Jafar Mann 6-4, 280, 4.9 Stone Mountain Stephenson, GA

On film this young man just jumps out at you, he's active, violent, quick as a cat, explosive, and tough. He was credited with 45 tackles and 5 sacks last season. Committed to FLORIDA.

249. OL Kyle Marrs 6-6, 310, 5.2 San Antonio Brandeis, TX

A big kid who has the frame to weigh between 320 and 330 in college. He really came into his own as a junior and earned 1st Team All-San Antonio honors. He's also a standout shot putter in track. Committed to OKLAHOMA.

250. OL Matt Cochran 6-3, 330, 5.5 Atwater Buhach, CA

Exceptionally quick in a limited space, he's one of the country's more technically sound center prospects. A dynamic run blocker, he graded out at 85% in his blocking assignments.

251. LB Raphael Kirby 6-2, 218, 4.66 Stone Mountain Stephenson, GA

A physical LB, he's a sure tackler who also excels at pass coverage. He recorded 120 stops, 3 sacks, and 21 tackles for losses as a junior, and he can make plays from sideline to sideline. Committed to MIAMI.

252. WR Marvin Bracy 5-9, 167, 4.22 Orlando Boone, FL

One of the fastest players in the country, he was timed in a 10.19 100 meters last spring. He shows the ability to play WR, CB, or FS. Caught 23 passes for 585 yds and 10 TDs averaging 25 yds per catch in 2010. Committed to FSU.

253. DE Josh Dawson 6-4, 225, 4.7 Tucker, GA

A high school DE who could wind up playing OLB at the next level. Earned 1st Team class 4A All-State honors in 2010 after totaling 44 tackles and 13½ sacks. Committed to VANDY.

254. OL Beau Boyster 6-5, 290, 5.3 Bellflower St. John Bosco, CA

One of the more versatile linemen in the west, he played tackle as a soph and last season he dominated at the center and guard positions. A two-time All-Area performer, he is committed to ARIZONA.

255. DL Quinteze Williams 6-5, 255, 4.9 Tyrone Sandy Creek, GA

Yet another DE who could possibly wind up playing DT in college, he recorded 12 QB sacks in 2010 and also earned All-League honors for his play at LT. Benches 320. Committed to FLORIDA.

256. OL Camrhon Hughes 6-7, 270, 5.0 Harker Heights, TX

He certainly has the length, quick feet, and overall athletic ability the college scouts are looking for. His film shows a natural knee bender who can dominate as a run blocker. Averages 7 points and 8 rebounds a game as a center in basketball. Committed to TEXAS.

257. WR Brandon Sheperd 6-3, 200, 4.43 Chesterfield Parkway Central, MO

A big, strong, and steady receiver who caught 22 passes for 557 yds and 6 TDs as a junior. He's been timed in a 10.6 100 meters. He can make the difficult catch look easy and is one of the most underrated WR prospects in the country.

258. QB Sean Maguire 6-3, 195, 4.8 West Orange Seton Hall Prep, NJ

The #1 pro-style QB in the state, he threw for 1,200 yds and 14 TDs and was picked off just 3 times on his way to earning All-Conference honors. A pocket passer with an over the top delivery, he shows the arm strength and smarts to make it big at the next level. Committed to FSU.

259. DL Dalvon Stuckey 6-3, 285, 5.0 DeFuniak Springs Walton, FL

One of the premier talents in the Florida Panhandle, he shows good pass rushing ability and outstanding skills against the run. Earned All-Conference and All-Big Bend mention in 2010. Committed to FSU.

260. QB Travis Wilson 6-6, 215, 4.8 San Clemente, CA

He certainly shows the height, excellent arm strength, poise, and all around athletic ability to make it big at the next level. He should fill out and wind up weighing between 230 and 240 in college. A two-time All-League honoree with a 3.6 GPA, he's committed to UTAH.

261. DL Hassan Ridgeway 6-4, 240, 4.7 Mansfield, TX

An emerging star, he impresses you at both the DE and TE positions. He looks thin at 240 pounds and should weigh between 270 and 280 in college. He shows natural pass rushing skills and is committed to TEXAS.

262. DL Channing Ward 6-4, 232, 4.7 Aberdeen, MS

He totaled close to 150 tackles and 16 sacks on his way to earning 2nd Team All-State honors in 2010. He makes plays from sideline to sideline, is excellent in pursuit, is very active, and shows a good closing burst. Ranks as one of the top five prospects in Mississippi.

263. QB Greyson Lambert 6-5, 200, 4.9 Jesup-Wayne Co., GA

A tall, very athletic QB with smarts, poise, and arm strength. He throws a nice, catchable ball and is adept at play action. He has a perfect 4.0 GPA.

264. LB Keith Brown 6-1, 210, 4.6 Miami Norland, FL
One of the fastest backers in the south, he's been timed in a 10.9 100 meters in track. He's excellent in coverage, rarely gets caught up in traffic, and plays the game on his feet. Known for his hard hitting style of play, he's committed to MIAMI.
265. DB Colin Blake 6-3, 190, 4.5 San Antonio Brandeis, TX
Not as well known as some of the other top prospects in the Southwest but believe me, this young man can play the game. He's a tall, athletic FS with length, long arms, quick hands, and even quicker feet. Earned All-City honors for his play at FS.
266. WR Eugene Lewis 6-2, 185, 4.5 Plymouth Wyoming Valley, PA
The #1 WR prospect in the state of Pennsylvania, his coach calls him one of the better all around athletes in the area. He's a force at the WR position and a clutch player with good hands, jumping ability, body control, and shows no fear of going over the middle. Earned All-Scranton area honors for his play at WR. Committed to PENN STATE.
267. TE Colin Thompson 6-6, 250, 4.7 Warminster Arch Bishop Wood, PA
One of the top two TE prospects in Pennsylvania, he also shows big-time ability at DE where he recorded 55 tackles and 8 QB sacks. Caught 13 passes for close to 200 yds and 8 scores on offense. Committed to FLORIDA.
268. DL Vincent Valentine 6-4, 315, 5.1 Edwardsville, IL
One of the best run stuffers in the Midwest, he plays the game on his feet, keeps his pads low, and at times he can keep as many as three blockers occupied at once. Recorded 35 tackles, 2 sacks, and 10 tackles for losses on his way to earning All-St. Louis Metro area honors in 2010.
269. DL Ronnie Feist 6-1, 225, 4.6 Edgard West St. John, LA
A small but explosive high school DE who could wind up playing either DE or OLB at the next level. Extremely competitive, he recorded 75 tackles, 22 sacks, and 35 tackles for losses on his way to earning 1st Team All-State honors at DE. Committed to LSU.
270. DB Edward Pope 6-3, 180, 4.5 Carthage, TX
He would rank even higher if he wasn't coming off knee surgery. What I saw on film was a good sized, athletic, and competitive FS with instincts, vision, and range. He rarely takes a missed step. A major talent with five-star potential. Committed to TCU.
271. QB Jake Rodrigues 6-3, 215, 4.6 Rocklin Whitney, CA
A 6-3 QB with terrific arm strength, he's as accurate as they come, can hit receivers on their numbers, and also impresses you with his ability to throw the deep out with authority. Threw for 2,100 yds and 22 TDs and ran for an additional 1,300 yds and 22 scores in 2010. Committed to OREGON.
272. WR Angelo Jean-Louis 6-1, 180, 4.5 Palm Beach Central, FL
A terrific all around athlete who is also a standout in soccer. Earned All-East Coast honors for his play on offense and helped his soccer team to two straight state titles. Committed to MIAMI.
273. WR Alton Howard 5-9, 175, 4.4 Orlando Edgewater, FL
A burner who can do it all and he's as competitive as they come. His brother Quincy McDuffie played WR at UCF. Rushed for 546 yds and 8 TDs averaging close to 11 yds per carry. He also caught 65 passes for 1,146 yds and 18 scores, and totaled 14 solo tackles at CB. He's been timed in a 10.6 100 meters.
274. QB Gray Crow 6-3, 220, 4.7 Clearwater Countryside, FL
A good sized signal caller with arm strength, toughness, and pocket awareness. Perfectly suited for the pro-style offense, he reads defenses well and shows a nice touch on his passes. He threw for 1,700 yds and 20 TDs as a junior. His GPA is a perfect 4.0. Committed to MIAMI.
275. ATH Bralon Addison 5-11, 185, 4.5 Missouri City Hightower, TX
A high school QB who is being recruited at the WR and DB positions. He threw for 1,900 yds and 28 TDs and also ran for 1,100 yds and 15 scores on his way to earning All-Greater Houston area honors. Committed to TEXAS A&M.
276. TE Sean Price 6-4, 215, 4.8 Citra North Marion, FL
He's called a major playmaker by his coach and by just about everyone who has played against him. He played around 200 pounds last season and he's 215 now and should weigh 240 in college. Committed to SOUTH FLORIDA.
277. OL Javarius Leamon 6-6, 271, 5.0 Woodruff, SC
Even though 2010 was his first year in football he earned 1st Team All-Area, All-Region, and All-State honors at LT. He has the sky is the limit type of potential and he graded out at 81% in his blocking assignments and recorded 64 pancake blocks as a junior. Committed to CLEMSON.
278. DL Carlos Hood 6-3, 260, 5.0 Stone Mountain Stephenson, GA
He forms quite a DT duo with Jafar Mann. He totaled 65 tackles, 6 sacks, and 20 tackles for losses in 2010. Committed to SOUTH CAROLINA.
279. QB Patton Robinette 6-5, 200, 4.7 Maryville, TN
He's your prototypical pro-style QB who shows a strong arm, makes good decisions, and is an excellent runner. He threw for 1,850 yds and 22 TDs and also ran for 950 yds and 11 scores as a junior. Committed to NORTH CAROLINA.
280. DL Torshiro Davis 6-3, 225, 4.6 Shreveport Woodlawn, LA
An undersized DE with explosive moves and a great future. Recorded 80 stops and 10 QB sacks on his way to earning 4A H-M All-State honors. Committed to LSU.
281. DB Reggie Daniels 6-0, 180, 4.6 Chadler Hamilton, AZ
One of the more consistent FS prospects in the West. He has played both FS and CB, he can break on the ball like no one's business, shows a smooth backpedal, and does a great job of jamming receivers at the line. A two-time All-Area selection at FS.
282. WR Darreus Rogers 6-2, 195, 4.5 Carson, CA
He caught 45 passes for 1,347 yds and 8 TDs averaging 30 yds per catch in 2010. Tall and athletic, he has an excellent vertical. Committed to USC.
283. OL Taylor Decker 6-8, 295, 5.2 Vandalia-Butler, OH
Next to Kyle Kalis there may not be a tackle in the state with as much potential as Taylor Decker. He looks thin at 295 and should weigh between 320 and 330 in college. He has a ways to go but the athletic ability is certainly there. He's a standout in football and basketball. Scored a 25 on the ACT and is committed to NOTRE DAME.
284. QB Ford Childress 6-4, 215, 4.85 Houston Kinkaid, TX
It's been a good year for potential QB prospects in the state of Texas and Ford is one of the best. He threw for 3,152 yds and 28 TDs last season and was picked off just once. He also ran for 505 yds and 8 scores. Committed to WEST VIRGINIA.
285. DB P.J. Williams 6-0, 175, 4.45 Ocala Vanguard, FL
A very physical CB with decent size, explosive moves, and a bright future. He recorded 75 stops and broke up 12 passes in 2010. Committed to FLORIDA STATE.
286. DL Dakota Ball 6-3, 300, 5.1 Lindale Pepperell, GA
He came on everyone's radar screen in the middle of last season after missing most of the '09 season due to injuries. One of the more dominating run stuffers, he's super strong and plays the game on his feet. Committed to ALABAMA.
287. ATH Max McCaffrey 6-3, 190, 4.5 Highlands Ranch Valor Christian, CO
His father Ed McCaffrey was one of my 1st Team All-Americans back in 1986 and went onto a great career at Stanford and with the Denver Broncos. Max is a two-way standout who totaled 50 tackles and picked off 4 passes returning 2 of them back for scores on his way to earning class 4A 1st Team All-State honors at FS. Committed to DUKE.
288. TE A.J. Williams 6-6, 265, 4.9 Cincinnati Sycamore, OH
A TE in high school who could wind up playing OT in college. He's a devastating run blocker who keeps his feet moving and shows good agility and balance. Committed to MICHIGAN.

289. TE Evan Baylis 6-5, 228, 4.8 Aurora Grandview, CO

The state's #1 TE prospect and one of the country's finest. A very flexible athlete who presents a big target over the middle and has shown the ability to take a hit. Caught 33 passes for 456 yds and 6 scores. Committed to OREGON.

290. QB Tyler O'Connor 6-3, 210, 4.65 Lima Central Catholic, OH

One of the most underrated QB prospects in the country, he shows a lot of skills. He can throw the ball accurately while on the run, shows a nice touch, and good arm strength and poise. Threw for 2,516 yds and 27 TDs while rushing for 480 yds and 13 scores. Committed to MICHIGAN STATE.

291. DL Danny O'Brien 6-2, 285, 5.0 Flint Powers Catholic, MI

Without a doubt one of the more impressive DT prospects in the Midwest. He displays power, explosiveness, attitude, and a relentless style of play, which has allowed him to record 87 stops, 9 sacks, and 21 tackles for losses. Earned All-City honors in 2010.

292. TE Ronald Thompson 6-4, 215, 4.6 Southfield, MI

Looks great at DE, TE, and WR. He caught 41 passes for 709 yds and 12 TDs in 2010. Also totaled 21 solo tackles and 3 sacks at DE. He's a standout in basketball and has the frame to weigh 250 in college.

293. RB Davon Jacobs 6-0, 185, 4.45 Wayne DePaul Catholic, NJ

One of the more versatile ball players in the state of New Jersey, he has played DB, RB, WR, and returned kicks. He recorded 64 stops, 4 picks at DB, and carried the ball 32 times for 322 yds and 5 scores at RB. Committed to RUTGERS.

294. DB Willie Bailey 6-2, 170, 4.4 Hallandale, FL

A wiry, instinctive, and surprisingly tough DB, he split his time between CB and FS in 2010. He recorded 81 stops, 2 picks, and broke up 9 passes on his way to earning All-County honors. He also blocked 4 punts and returned 1 kickoff back for a score. Committed to FLORIDA.

295. OL Nathan Dean 6-6, 275, 5.1 Kirkland Juanita, WA

He's been overshadowed locally by Josh Garnett and Zach Banner, but believe me this young man can hold his own. I was impressed with his run blocking ability, his quickness in setting up for the pass, and his technique. He gets great extension and once he latches on, it's all over. Earned All-Area and All-State mention for his play at tackle. Committed to WASHINGTON.

296. DE Brent Wilkerson 6-4, 245, 4.8 Hyattsville DeMatha, MD

He plays opposite Michael Moore giving DeMatha a couple of super pass rushing ends. A blue collar and steady performer, he can make plays down the line, always gives great effort when in pursuit, and is fundamentally strong. He totaled 85 tackles and 10 sacks as a junior. Also caught 8 passes for 168 yds and 3 scores at TE. Committed to PENN STATE.

297. DL Vontrell Williams 6-3, 275, 4.85 Chicago Mount Carmel, IL

Plays both DE and DT and does a great job of defeating one-on-one blocks. In his first game this season he more than held his own against the Saints #1 prospect Jordan Diamond. He recorded 40 tackles and 15 sacks on his way to earning All-Catholic League honors. Committed to ILLINOIS.

298. OL Kyle Dodson 6-6, 310, 5.1 Cleveland Heights, OH

The Northeast section of Ohio is absolutely loaded with talent this season and one of the very best prospects in Mr. Dodson. Blessed with great size, long arms, quick feet, and a great attitude. Earned All-City honors for his play at LT. Committed to WISCONSIN.

299. RB Dami Ayoola 5-10, 200, 4.5 Ft. Lauderdale Aquinas, FL

He ran for 700 yds and 10 TDs averaging 6.8 yds per carry against the best competition in the country. He also caught 15 passes for 300 yds and he's a plugger who has been timed in an 11.2 100 meters.

300. DL Darren Lake 6-3, 330, 5.3 York Sumter Co., AL

One of the fastest rising DT prospects in the country, he occupies more than one blocker on every play, shows a good initial push, quick feet, plays the game on his feet, and is a stonewall against the run. Committed to ALABAMA.
